## **Disaster Recovery Center Open in Collier County**

**TALLAHASSEE, Fla.** – FEMA has opened a Disaster Recovery Center in Collier County to provide one-on-one help to Floridians affected by Hurricane Milton and Hurricane Helene. Survivors of Hurricane Debby can also be served by the center.

Survivors do **not** need to visit a center to apply for assistance. Survivors are encouraged to apply online at <a href="DisasterAssistance.gov">DisasterAssistance.gov</a> or by downloading the <a href="FEMA App">FEMA App</a>. FEMA does not distribute cash at Disaster Recovery Centers.
